



6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The college has to abide by the curriculum set by the affiliating University. This curriculum is framed by the Board of Studies in the respective subject. Two teachers of our college acts as member in such board of studies.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning :

Teaching aid:

Assessment:

- Class Tests arranged by the respective department.
- Compulsory Mid Term Test taken for first year students
- Compulsory Selection tests for students of each year taken before considering them eligible to appear at the university examinations.

Remedial measures:

- Remedial classes for SC/ST/OBC/ minority students are conducted regularly.
- Tutorial classes are conducted for students and special classes are conducted for slow learners.
- Guardian meet is organised to inform about the progress of their wards

Faculty Improvement Programme:

• Faculties are encouraged to attend Refresher Courses, Orientation Programmes, Summer/Winter schools and workshops and the college grants necessary leave to such incumbents.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation :

- The University norms are followed for examination and evaluation of UG students.
- College conducts Selection Test prior to the finals for all courses.
- The class tests are taken by all departments as and when required. Results of Mid terminal and Selection Tests are communicated to the students and evaluated answer scripts are shown to the students for their qualitative improvement.
- \blacktriangleright The progress is reported to the Guardians specially to the weaker students.

6.3.4 Research and Development:

- Some teachers are pursuing Ph.D. work.
- Teachers are encouraged to engage themselves in research projects. A minor research project is going on in the Department of Sociology.
- A good number of faculties are involved in preparing and presenting their papers in International and National level seminar.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- Virtual Classroom is in full operation.
- Wi-Fi zone has fostered easy access to internet throughout the campus
- Library has joined N-LIST programme (conducted by INFLIBNET). E-Journals and e-books can be availed by this.
- Coputerized Bar coding is complete. It has helped to access more titles easily.
- Physics laboratory has come into operation.
- Almost all strategic locations are under CCTV surveillance

6.3.6 Human Resource Management :

- The college effectively functions with the help and guidance of different committees/sub-committees viz. Sexual Harassment Prevention and Redressal Cell, Equal opportunity Cell, College Development Board, Anti-ragging Committee. Students' Grievances are redressed promptly.
- Students' Council conducts different programmes for all round development of the students through their Games and Sports Unit, Cultural Unit, Debate Unit and Students' Welfare Unit.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment :

- Requisitions for filling-up vacant teaching post (On retirement and resignation) are sent to the College Service Commission (CSC).
- College has recruited some CWTT in different subjects through a selection committee.

IQAC is giving great thrust for such interaction and collaboration and exploring avenues to interact and directly collaborate with industries. We are in the process of signing MOU with some training institutes to groom the students and make them job-ready.
